An emergency could happen to anyone.

November 9 is Firefighting Day. During this season, the air is dry and fires are likely to occur. Learn how to protect your life and the lives of your loved ones in case of emergency.

November 9-15 is the Autumn National Fire Prevention Campaign time. Let's build a cooperative system with our neighbors and improve the fire prevention and safety system in our community.

Case 1 - A fire broke out! What should we do?

Point 1 - Notify people of the fire.

Shout loudly that there is a fire.

Use an emergency bell or other means to report the fire and call 119.





Point 2 – Initial firefighting can be done in 1 to 2minutes after the fire broke out, using a fire extinguisher.

1 Pull out the safety pin.





② Remove the hose and point the hose toward the possible fire.

Effective shooting distance is 3-5 meters.

The fire extinguishers spray for 10 to 15 seconds.

Point 3 - A fire that has spread up to the ceiling cannot be put out.

Evacuate quickly! The scariest point of the fire is the smoke.

A smoke inhalation might cause you to lose consciousness.

Cover your mouth with a handkerchief to prevent smoke inhalation.

Case 2 -When you find a person who has fallen down or collapsed

The number of ambulance mobilizations in 2022 ⇒ 5642 cases (An increase of 755 cases compared to 2021)

- ➤ Average time to arrive at the scene ⇒ 7.7 minutes
- ➤ Average number of dispatches per day ⇒ 15.5 cases
- > One case per 1.5 hour /One case per 16.9 citizens



Point 1-Check the safety of your surroundings.



Tap the person gently on the shoulder and call loudly, "Are you all right?" Do not shake strongly to prevent illness or injury from worsening.

Point 2 - Look for someone nearby to help you.

When the patient is unconscious or unresponsive, call loudly for help from those around you.



Point 3 - Ask each collaborator to call 119 and to bring an AED respectively.

Be sure to ask them to return.







Point 4 - Check for breathing.



If the patient is not breathing, try to perform chest compressions. When artificial respiration is available, repeat chest compressions 30 times and artificial respiration 2 times.

Point 5 - Follow the AED's voice instruction. It is important to check the location of AED in our daily lives.



Your cooperation for appropriate 119 call will be appreciated!

The number of emergency cases has been increasing. Among them, there is an increase of the number of dispatches that are not for urgent illness or injury. The easy use of ambulances has resulted in the delays in emergency transport to those who really need it. This is a nationwide problem. In our city, about 2,000 cases of the emergency calls during last year were not urgent. Calling 119 out of mischief is a crime.

■What should we do if we hear an earthquake earning warning?

"Shakeout" is an action to protect yourself from earthquakes. When an earthquake occurs, get ready to Shakeout.

(1) Drop down onto your hands and knees! (2) Cover your head! (3) Hold on and don't move!

In case of an earthquake, keep calm and take appropriate action to reduce injury, while checking on people around you according to the surrounding conditions.



Social Insurance Contribution Deduction Certificate



Social insurance contribution deduction certificates (社会保険料控除証明書 shakai hoken-ryo kojo shomei-sho) are mailed at the beginning of November. The certificate confirms the amount of National Pension (国民年金 kokumin nenkin) contribution payments made over the course of one year. The paid

amount is eligible for social insurance premium deduction. For those who made a contribution payment for the first time on or after Tue., October 3, 2023, certificates will be mailed at the beginning of February 2024.

Information about the COVID-19 Vaccination (As of Oct. 19)

Autumn 2023 Start Vaccination (Vaccine for Omicron strain, XBB1.5)

Vaccinations against the Omicron XBB strain are available now.

- Target persons: Persons aged 6 months or over who have completed the initial vaccinations and three months have passed since their previous vaccination
- X The vaccination starting autumn 2023 is not obligatory, however, it is strongly advised for the elderly aged 65 and over, or those with underlying medical conditions or whose doctors decide they are high risk of developing severe symptoms. Please consider the effects and side effects of the vaccination before you decide whether or not to have the vaccination.
- ■Type of vaccine used: Monovalent vaccine for Omicron strain, XBB1.5

 Over 6 years of age: Pfizer and Moderna vaccine

 Under 5 years of age: Pfizer vaccine
- ※The type of vaccine used differs depending on the age of target persons.
- *Regarding the effectiveness of the COVID-19 vaccine, it has been reported that the effect of preventing infection and onset of the disease lasts for about 2-3 months, and the effect of preventing the disease from becoming more severe lasts for more than a year,
- ■Vaccination period: Until the end of March, 2024
- ■Vaccination coupon: The vaccination coupon will be mailed to those eligible approx. ten days before three months have passed since their previous shot. If you have already received a coupon and did not use it, please use the coupon for the vaccination.
- How to make an appointment: Make an appointment at individual medical institutions.
- XAppointment method may vary depending on each medical institution.
- ※Please check medical institutions on the city's website or Koho Ashiya, August issue.
- XAny changes in medical institutions will be updated on the city website as needed. Please check the latest information on the city's website.








Circumstances of Decrease in Municipal Tax Revenue due to Furusato Kifu

(Furusato Kifu (Furusato Nozei): Hometown Tax Donation System)



Municipal tax revenue in fiscal 2022 decreased by 890 million ven (890,000,000 yen) due to the tax deduction for Furusato Kifu (Furusato Nozei.) by citizens.

The total amount of Furusato Kifu offered to Ashiva City from all over the country was about 80 million yen (80,000,000 yen); therefore, the net result was a substantial decrease in revenue of about 810 million yen (810.000.000 ven).

Over the past few years, municipal revenues have decreased significantly with the spread of Furusato Nozei System

We wish to respect the thoughts of the donors, but also we face the decrease of municipal tax revenues; both are very important. While informing you, the citizens, about the current status of reduced revenues so you may understand the various aspects of the System, we would like to work on better utilizing of the donations and the expansion of portal site, so people outside of Ashiya may become more interested in Ashiya.

At first, I wondered why the city established this ordinance now. Because the ordinance was created after I opened the cake shop, I thought my store would be all right.

I'm glad that I was a part of the story of how to make the city a great place to live and I cooperated. If we become attached to the city, we can pass it to our children. If the city becomes a place we can be proud of, some rules will naturally disappear.
